

Our service area includes the footprint of the former Carlisle Hospital & Health Services.

Commitment to Health Equity

To reach health equity, communities must take collective action to address policies, systems, and structures that influence health. Across our work, we seek to engage neighbors and residents and amplify voices that are not always heard to ensure that all people have the chance to enjoy healthy lives.



The foundation began in 2001 with \$58 million from the sale of Carlisle Hospital and related trusts. Since then, over \$49.2 million has been invested in the community through grants and initiatives.

Affordable Housing & Homelessness

With its 2022 strategic plan, Community Partners for Change has been advancing its mission is to effect positive and sustainable change in the housing system by educating the community about housing needs; advocating for programs, policies, and funding; and acting on new opportunities. With the leadership of its Advisory Council of key leaders in Cumberland County, efforts are under way to engage landlords to increase affordable rental options and to improve coordination among organizations serving homeless individuals and families.

Perry County Health Coalition

The coalition is dedicated to improving access to health services in Perry County. The United Way of the Capital Region joins with us as a proud funder of this work. In 2023, we have renewed our commitment by engaging PoP Health, LLC, to lead the members in working towards the coalition goals and activities to improve health care access.
